STRESZCZENIE PRACY W JĘZYKU ANGIELSKIM

Migration is about experience. Experiencing migration is experiencing space embedded in mobility, it is getting used to and experiencing the places where migrants live. I made transnational migrations the main topic of my dissertation, focusing on temporary and incomplete migrations as their special type. Adopting the perspective of temporality has an impact on the way migration is experienced in categories such as space, time, place, identity and mobility. As part of my research, I am looking for answers to the question: how Polish temporary emigrants in Switzerland experience their migration in the context of time, place and mobility. As part of my dissertation, I am interested in stories about migration in order to gain insight into what meanings and meanings are revealed by Polish temporary migrants in Switzerland within the narratives provided to me. In the pages of this work, I also refer to my own autoethnographic investigations from the period of my own migration to Switzerland. I place my research in a phenomenological-hermeneutic research orientation, placing it in the mainstream of narrative research. As part of my work, I gain insight into my own and other people's migration experiences shared with me through narrative interviews. Additionally, using the theory of the processual nature of an individual's life by Gerhard Riemann and Fritz Schütze, I present my own migration experiences from the perspective of trajectories and chaotic social processes. As part of the research problem that interests me, I use the following research concepts: the concept of mobility, the pedagogy of place, the concept of non-place, the concept of place as atopy, the concept of place as heterotropy, the concept of home and nonhome, the concept of identity, psychology of place, memory of place, contemporary nomadism. The topic of my chosen dissertation is related to my own migration experiences.
