## **1. Purpose of the Call**

The purpose of this Open Call is to select participants for the Q-Helix International Thematic School on Health entitled:

### **Future Health Professionals: Medicine, AI and Society**

The School is organised within the framework of the **Q-Helix Alliance** and contributes to the Alliance strategic thematic area of:

#### **Healthcare Innovation**

The School will focus on contemporary challenges related to healthcare, artificial intelligence, ethics, interdisciplinary cooperation, and future competences of health professionals. Particular attention will be given to the responsible and effective use of emerging technologies in healthcare, the growing role of artificial intelligence in medical practice, and the importance of interdisciplinary collaboration in addressing complex health and societal challenges.

The programme has been designed to provide participants with an international, interdisciplinary and practice-oriented learning experience. Students will have the opportunity to engage with experts from different academic and professional backgrounds, exchange perspectives with peers from across Europe, and develop competences relevant to future careers in healthcare, research, technology, public policy and related fields.

The School will combine:

- lectures delivered by academic experts and practitioners;
- practical workshops and simulations;
- case studies and problem-solving activities;
- interdisciplinary teamwork;
- discussions on ethical, legal and social implications of emerging technologies;
- networking and intercultural learning activities.

Participation in the School offers students the opportunity to:

- develop knowledge related to contemporary healthcare challenges;
- explore the applications of artificial intelligence in healthcare environments;
- strengthen critical thinking and analytical skills;
- improve communication and teamwork competences in interdisciplinary settings;
- gain experience in international and intercultural cooperation;
- establish contacts with students and academics from Q-Helix partner universities;



- broaden their understanding of future trends shaping healthcare systems and professions.

Participants who successfully complete the programme will receive a **Certificate of Competences** issued by the Host Institution.

## **2. School Dates and Location**

### **Locations:**

Bucharest and Olimp–Constanța, Romania

Participants selected for the School should plan their travel in accordance with the organisational information provided by the Host Institution.

Detailed travel, accommodation and logistical information will be communicated to selected participants before the School.

## **3. Number of Participants**

The School will host up to **30 participants**:

- up to **20 Local Participants** from Universitatea Titu Maiorescu;
- up to **10 Participants from Q-Helix member universities other than Universitatea Titu Maiorescu.**

Participation shall be granted according to the order of submission of complete and eligible applications in accordance with the Open Call Regulations for Participants of Q-Helix International Thematic Schools.

**No more than three participants from the same institution may participate in the School.**

## **4. Target Group**

The School is open to students enrolled at institutions belonging to the Q-Helix Alliance.

Particular interest is expected from students representing:

- medicine;
- nursing;
- physiotherapy;
- public health;
- health sciences;
- psychology;
- social sciences;
- law;
- artificial intelligence;
- computer science;
- related disciplines.

Students from other disciplines may also apply if they demonstrate a clear interest in the School topic.

## **5. Programme Topics**

The School will address, among others:

- cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR);
- artificial intelligence in healthcare;
- ethical and legal aspects of AI;
- neuro-law;
- interdisciplinary healthcare cooperation;
- future challenges for health professionals;
- responsible and safe use of AI in healthcare environments;
- communication and teamwork in interdisciplinary settings.

In addition to educational activities, participants will take part in workshops, case studies, practical demonstrations, networking activities and intercultural exchange sessions.

## **7. Selection Principles**

Applications shall be evaluated in accordance with the Open Call Regulations for Participants of Q-Helix International Thematic Schools.

Participants shall be selected according to:

- fulfilment of all eligibility requirements;
- successful completion of the formal evaluation process;
- order of submission of complete applications;
- availability of places.

Applications that do not meet all formal requirements may be rejected.

## **8. Financial Support**

Participants from Q-Helix member universities other than the Host Institution may receive:

- Travel Grant;
- Accommodation and Subsistence Grant.

Financial support shall be awarded in accordance with:

- the Open Call Regulations for Participants of Q-Helix International Thematic Schools;
- Annex No. 4 – Travel Grant Calculation Rules;
- Annex No. 5 – Accommodation and Subsistence Grant Calculation Rules;
- applicable NAWA Programme rules.

Local Participants shall participate free of charge but shall not receive mobility grants.

## **9. Competence Validation and Certification**

All participants shall complete:

- a pre-test assessment at the beginning of the School;

- a post-test assessment at the end of the School.

The comparison of pre-test and post-test results shall constitute the primary mechanism for assessing competence acquisition and learning outcomes achieved during participation in the School.

Participants who successfully complete the School programme shall receive a **Certificate of Competences** issued by the Host Institution.

## **10. Submission of Applications**

### **Local Participants (Universitatea Titu Maiorescu)**

Students of Universitatea Titu Maiorescu shall follow the recruitment procedure established internally by the Host Institution.
